This letter shows you a little about my mother Dorothy. She was a very loving, caring, and giving person. She loved her children. This letter touches me each time I read it because I feel the love. As you can see, my mother's spelling was not very good as she only went to the 3rd grade. She was a brilliant woman however. She was a wonderful mother. I miss her each and every day. She was a true Dedmon(d)
