Lost Relatives???

Senecca Dedmon has long been a mystery to Dedmon researchers. He shows up in Georgia at a very early date, born October 25, 1799 and died in Wright, MO on March 03, 1888. I also believe he lived in Arkansas for a while (not 100% sure of that). He married Beda Pool, daughter of William Pettypool and Margaret Tarbutton. Who are Senecca's parents???? Somebody out there ought to know, please help us. Here is what we have:

Descendants of Senecca A. Dedmon

Generation No. 1: 1. Senecca A. Dedmon was born October 25, 1799 in GA, and died March 03, 1888 in MO. He married Beda Pool February 19, 1826. Children of Senecca Dedmon and Beda Pool are:

- ii. Isaac D. Dedmon, born October 06, 1828 in GA.
- iii. Henry Pool Dedmon, born March 17, 1830 in GA; died April 27, 1912.
- iv. Allen Dedmon, born May 01, 1832 in MO; died April 08, 1906.
- v. Mary Dedmon, born May 07, 1834 in MO.
- vi. Jasper N. Dedmon, born December 27, 1835 in MO; died January 17, 1862.
- vii. John Washington Dedmon, born August 09, 1837 in MO; died March 11, 1919.
- viii. Hartwell P. Dedmon, born September 20, 1839 in MO; died January 05, 1922.
- ix. Sarah Annis Dedmon, born July 12, 1841 in AR; died July 03, 1924 in Fresno, CA. She married (1) William W. Clark. She married (2) Jonathan Hellums. She married (3) James Austin Maddy October 15, 1865.
- x. Avery L. Dedmon, born May 11, 1843 in AR; died June 28, 1863.
- xi. Seneca S. Dedmon, born June 04, 1847 in AR; died September 01, 1878.
- xii. Joseph Asberry Dedmon, born September 04, 1850 in Berryville, Carroll County, AR; died September 03, 1932.

I found these Dedmons from "Roster of the Confederate Soldiers of Georgia". I found corresponding names in the family tree, but with mostly initials to go by, how can you be sure if it is indeed the same person? Muster Roll of Company C, 60th Regiment Georgia Volunteer Infantry Evans' Brigade, Gordon Division Army of Northern Virginia J.T. Dedmond, private Sept. 19, 1861: Discharged April 23, 1862 Muster Roll of 2d Company E, 1st Confederate Infantry Army of Tennessee Bartow County, Georgia. Dedmon, C. Private, May 1, 1862; Deserted July 10, 1862. Dedmon, John J. Private, April 15, 1863. Wounded at Peachtree Creek, Georgia July 20, 1864. In Macon, Georgia hospital August 31, 1864. Dedmon, Thomas W. Private, May 1, 1862. Deserted in 1864. Took oath of allegiance to U.S. Govt. at Louisville, Kentucky and released to remain north of Ohio River during war July 16, 1864. Muster Roll of Company H, 2d Regiment: Georgia Volunteer Infantry, Army of Northern Virginia Whitfield Co., Georgia ("Wright Infantry") John J. Dedmon, Private July 1, 1861. Appears last on roll for August 31, 1861. T. H. Dedmon, Private July 1, 1861. Enlisted for 9 months and 13 days. No later record. W. R. Dedmon, Private April 20, 1861. Wounded, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania July 2, 1863. Roll for December 31, 1864, last of file, shows him absent, wounded. Let me know if you are sure which ones these are in our tree.
