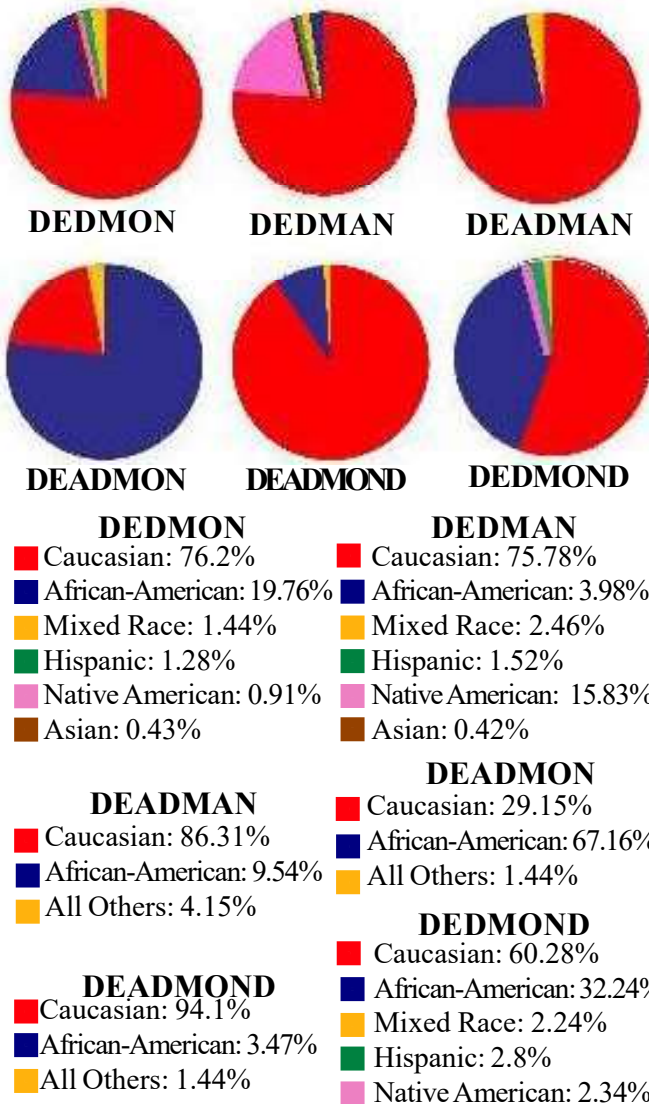




FROM WHENCE DID OUR ANCESTORS COME?

The origin of the races is a question that does plague most of us as we often ponder the question, "From where did my ancestors come?" Growing up, I was always told the Dedmons were of German and Dutch descent. However, research does not bear that out as we seem to end up in England as we trace back. Of course, that does not completely rule out the German-Dutch Nationality. We only have records back to around 1400 in England and some of those folk could have been from Germany and Holland. At least it is possible.

One thing for certain is that there are Deadmans and all variation of spelling in other nations and ethnic groups. The pie chart shows the ethnic breakdown of the surname "Dedmon/Dedman/Deadmon/Deadman, etc." as reported by the U.S. Census Bureau in 2000.



The Most popular given name in the Dedmon line is James and number two is William (Bill), Number three is Robert and number 4, John. Other popular first names for Dedmon include: Thomas, Charles, Mark, Elizabeth and George. There are 2,188 listed in the United States with the name Dedmon, which is the most of all the varied spellings of our name. The state with the most Dedmons is California, but the one with most per capita is Arkansas.

The surname Dedman is the second most popular spelling of the surname with 1,236 and Arkansas is also the state with the most per capita. However, the state with the most listed is Tennessee. The first names are about the same as the ones in Dedmon. The one exception among our ancestors may have been the name Samuel. For the women, Elizabeth and Mary lead the list and even Mary Elizabeth. Also, Dedman has by far the most Native Americans, with Airzona being the state with the most.

Our original spelling, Deadman probably has the least number that are registered in the USA showing slightly over 250. However, I am quite certain that England and Canada will help increase that number. An interesting fact here is that Washington DC has the most per capita. Some of their most popular first names are Thomas, Robert, Richard and Charles.

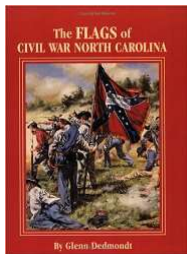

The spelling Deadmon swings back and forth within the Deadman family. There are several families with both spellings among the siblings. There are about the same number of them as there are Deadmans. Again, Arkansas has the most per capita, with Texas having the most in number. It is also interesting in that the majority of this spelling is African-American. I have no clue as to why, but that is true of all the variations.

The spelling Deadmond is almost exclusively used by the decedents of Thomas Deadmond and Elizabeth Milliron. It is an interesting family and Volume 103 of this Newsletter is devoted to them. There are around 400 of them and of all the places, Montana has the most per capita. There are around 50 buried in Oregon. Illinois has the most number of Deadmond families currently living there..

Dedmond is found less than 250 with most being in North Carolina. The oldest record I have of this spelling is Charles "Charley" Dedmond, born 1858 in Jessamine County, KY I have some close cousins who added the "d" on the end of Dedmon to keep their mail from getting mixed up with other family members who lived nearby. It is very common to find the varied spellings within the same family.



There are other variations of our surname, but I chose these six to publish as they are the most common. For example the spelling, Dedmondt, originated with George Canton Dedmondt, the son of Esby Walter Dedmond and appears to have stayed within that family. George's son, Glen is a published author. I found six books at Amazon written by him which include, "*Flags of Civil War North Carolina, The (Flags of the Civil War)*"

Our surname is listed under the Soundex code D355. Soundex is a hashing system for English words. From an English word, you generate a letter and three numbers, that roughly describe how a given word sounds. Similar sounding words will have similar codes. Other surnames listed under this code include: Dudmon, Dudman, Dodman, Dittman, Dietman, Dietmann, Dittman, and the one that really surprised me, Didomenico. The variation of Denman appears in areas where our family is known to have been there as several are buried in Catoosa County, GA

There is some speculation of several Denmans buried in the cemetery at the Old Stone Church in Ringgold that they may actually be Dedmons, but I have not found any proof of it. I have at least eight in my data base and two others in Catoosa County. There are at least four Dedmons buried at the Stone Church Cemetery.



In 1837 settlers organized the Chickamauga Presbyterian Church on this site, eventually building a small log cabin in which to worship. On 1849 the congregation decided to build a new church. Using rock from nearby Taylor Ridge and Stubblefield Farm, the new building was completed in 1850. During the Battle of Ringgold Gap Joseph Hooker, United States fought Patrick Cleburne north of the church and Cleburne used the church as a hospital. After Cleburne withdrew Union officers used the church as a stable. In 1912 the Chickamauga Presbyterian Church was formed and they requested the Ringgold Church give up the name.

The church served briefly as a Methodist Church after the Presbyterians moved into Ringgold in 1920. After that, the church sat empty until the Catoosa County Historical Association took control of the building in the 1950's. While constructing the I-75 interstate highway through Ringgold Gap, remnants of an old Cherokee village were found. Archeologists were called in to catalog the site and the remains of the village were moved to storage. Some of these remains are on display in the church, which also has the original lectern and pews.

There are 316 graves with recorded known names. However, there are several unmarked and I am not sure if all the graves have been identified. I lived less than ten miles from the cemetery for about ten years and was never able to locate all of the Dedmon sites. It has been said the hymn, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms," was sung there for the first time. I am not sure how this would actually be known.

I have discovered at least five major Deadman branches that we have not been able to connect. If you have information on any of the Deadman family branches, please submit.

I get a lot of inquiries concerning our family and the connection to Native Americans. There is no doubt of connection to some parts of the family. I also know that many of the claims are at the least, unproven. I wrote quite a bit about it in Volume 93 of this Newsletter and some of this article will be duplicated. However, here is what we are fairly certain about.



JACOB CRAZY WOLFE

Most of the claims on my line of the family go back to Jacob "Crazy" Wolfe, who was born about 1776 in Stokes County NC. He died July 23, 1796 in W VA. He married Mary Polly Deadman, about 1794 in Old Rowan County, NC. There is some disagreement as to the date of Mary Polly's birth. It is listed at different sites anywhere from 1759 to 1777. My records show her birth as September 10, 1759. I won't argue the point as I am not sure. Most researchers agree she was the daughter of Thomas Charles and Sarah Griffin Deadman. There has been some confusion with this Mary Polly and the daughter of Mark. In fact some researchers have Mark's daughter as the wife of Jacob Wolfe. However, Mark's daughter was born in 1786 and would have been less than ten years old when they married. Jacob "Crazy" Wolfe was said to have been killed by the "British" in the Revolutionary War!

They had two children, Jacob and Michael. Mary Polly died February 13, 1799 in Rowan County, NC and is buried in the Deadman Cemetery, Mocksville, Davie County, NC. Jacob and Mary's son, Jacob, married Nancy McEntire and I do not know what happened to Michael. As far as I can tell, there are no Dedmon descendents in the lineage of Jacob Wolf, although some of the McEntire family connects with us, there is no direct blood line that I have discovered..

Also, from the same Tribe, was John Linkhorn and Running Deer. Their daughter, Mary Polly Linkhorn, married Thomas Charles Dedmon, the son of Mark Richard and Hannah Bailey Dedmon. so from this union we do have a direct blood line to some of the Dedmons. Their son, John Lane Dedmon, married Nancy Ann Singletary. Nancy Ann Singletary's father

and mother were, James Thomas Singletary and Prudence "Little Fox" Cheshire. Prudence "Little Fox" Cheshire's father and mother were, Prudence "Sly Fox" Bryan and Richard Cheshire. So the blood line gets a little thicker through this connection. One of their sons, James Thomas Dedmon, married Susanah Rebecca McEntire, which does connect them back to Jacob Wolfe's family, but not a blood line.

Many of the desendents of James Thomas and Susanah migrated from North Carolina to Georgia and on to Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas and on to California leaving some along the way in the states between. Some of these as well as other kinsmen who followed suit are found in the Choctaw Nation Marriages Index. Included in these are Lon Dedman and Bertie Banks; Joe Dedmon and Della Anderson; John Dedmon and Mattie Duncan. Copyright issues prevent me from copying the information, but it is a matter of public record on the internet.

Lon Dedman is actually Alonzo C. (Lon) Dedmon, the son of Morris Harrison and Nancy Emma Duncan Dedmon. It appears the Duncan family was in fact part of the Indian Nation. Lon married Birdie Banks. Joe Dedmon, who married Della Anderson was a brother to Lon and John Dedmon, who married Mattie Duncan was the son of Abram Oliver and Rachel A. Gentry Dedmon. Abram was my grandfather's first cousin and Rachel was nmy mothers great aunt. So it is easy to see why so many claims to "Indian" blood float around as many of us are related to those who are in fact.

I have this note from Sherry Dedmon Coffel: My grandfather's name was Joseph Earl Dedmon and he was part Cherokee. I'm researching his side of the family but I do remember my father telling me that when he was a child that they lived on a reservation in Oklahoma where my father was born. Some of the family also owned a store and ran the post office in Poteau Ok years ago, or so I was told.

Joseph Earl was the son of Mattie Duncan and John Dedmon. Mattie was born in Indian Territory, AR. It has been fairly well established the Duncan family was Native American. I hope Sherry sees this and contacts me as I have lost her email. --Leroy

Another established link to the Native American lineage is the Dedman family in Arizona. I have information back to Clitas (Clitso) Dedman in 1877, but I have been unable to locate his parents. I received an email several years ago from Miller Dedman III, inquiring of information concerning the Native American connection. Clitso was his great grandfather. I was not able to help him as I did not know then as much as I do now.

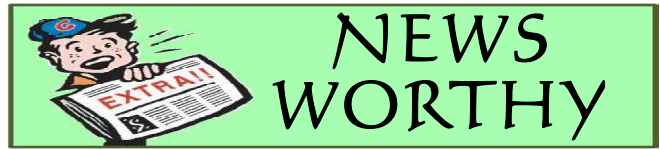
Here is another interesting note I discovered:

Hi, have any of you Dedmon/Deadman researchers run across a connection to the Malicoat (Mallicoat) family of VA and TN. My ggg grandfather was Dedmon (Deadman) Malicoat born around 1778 in VA. He moved to TN before 1809. His mother is only know by her first name Ellender. Could she be a Dedmon? I had talked to a Malicoat researcher several years ago that thought the Dedmon was Indian and not French. I apologize if I missed any discussions pertaining to the Dedmon name. -Stan, a Hoosier in PA

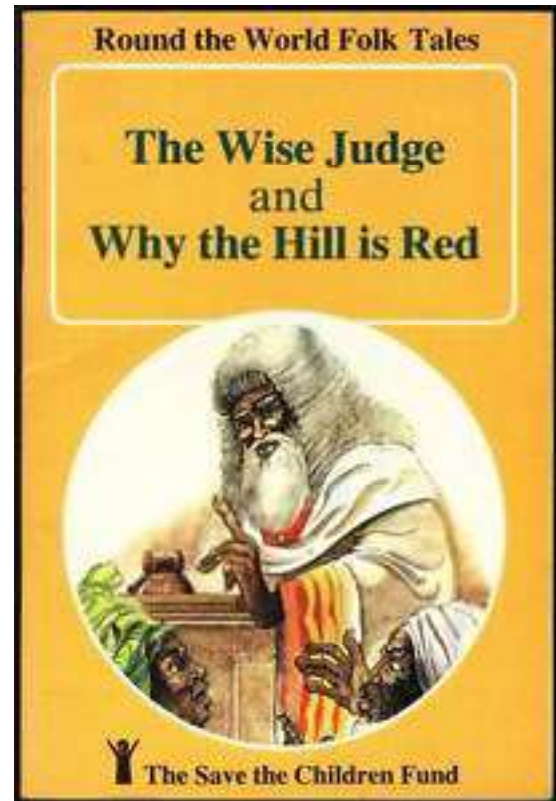
Actually the best I can tell is that Ellender is Ellender Love Deadman/Dedman, but there is confusion as to her father. There are a few sites on Ancestry.com that say her parents were Samuel and Mary Dixon Dedman. The problem that this creates is that most all researchers list Ellender as born in 1755. Some say Jan. 1, 1755. However, Samuel and Mary have a daughter, Sarah Dedman, who was born May 31, 1755 in Albemarle County, VA.

Another problem I found with this listing is her marriage to John Mallicoat on January 2, 1760 as she would have only been seven years old. I finally located some information on another website that had her birth as 1744/45, which certainly would solve one problem, but that removes Samuel and Mary as parents. This particular Samuel is one of my "dead end" lines as I cannot find his parents. With as many Samuels as we have in our family it is easy to see why we have problems like this in our research.

I found a couple of places where this Samuel is listed as the son of Philip and Margaret Easter Langston Dedman, Jr. There are some serious problems with this namely Phillip and Margaret married in 1749 and their Samuel was born 1750 and married Eleanor Howard in 1771. There is a slight possibility Philip could have had another son, Samuel, by a previous relationship, as he had some children by an unknown source, but there is no record of his having two sons named Samuel. I found an interesting suggestion on another site saying his father was Charles Debnam. I also found several Samuel Dudmans. Hmmmm.....
