

8-Year Old Nancy Dedman Inspires Parents To Help Other Families with \$2.35 Million Food Allergy Center At Children’s Medical Center

The belle of the ball had to miss the fancy seated dinner, the VIP’s and world-renowned speakers Wednesday night for the dedication of the Food Allergy Center at Children’s Medical Center. She had to go home early and do her homework. The little Cinderella was 8-year old Nancy Dedman, (pictured) who, besides being a Hockaday student, was the impetus for the creation of the center at the Pavilion at CMC. It seems that following a severe allergic reaction to a certain food, her parents Rachael and Robert Dedman rolled up their sleeves to learn more about this potential life-threatening condition. One of the things that they discovered was that Children’s annually treats more than 560 children with food allergies. “I didn’t know much about food allergies until Nancy was diagnosed,” said Rachael. “It is a steep learning curve for families when their loved one is newly identified as having food allergies.”

And when the Dedmans undertake a project, they become experts and put their money in just the right places. Traveling throughout the country, they talked with specialists in the area of allergies and along with grandmother Nancy Dedman they provided CMC with the \$2.35 million center.

Last night before the reception and dinner, Little Nancy got a sneak preview of the clinic. It’s doubtful that she realized all the life-changing experiences that would result from her allergy. But like any youngster, she was immediately drawn to the observation room with its marker walls. There on a table was a box of colorful markers. She knew exactly what to do, picked out some colors and started drawing on the wall. After all that’s what it was meant for.

While the adults including keynote speaker Dr. Hugh Sampson, professor of pediatrics at Mount Sinai School of Medicine in New York, Dedman parents and Dr. Drew Bird (Children’s allergy and immunology specialist and Dedman Family Scholar in Child Care) had the “official” photos taken, Nancy continued her work.



Was she drawing a garden? Or was she just simply autographing the wall? When Dr. Sampson, (pictured left) joined Nancy, she revealed that she had drawn a picture of her “best friend”, Daisy Dedman (pictured), her puppy. But then it was time to go home and get homework done. Every Hockadaisy knows that school work is a priority over partying.

Alas, she was gone just minutes before her grandmother

pulled up in her black Lexus. “Where is my granddaughter?” were the first words out of the grand lady. Finding that she had just missed her namesake, she quickly got over the timing

The only information are her birth and death dates. (Jan. 8, 1904- Apr. 1, 1993) There are four other Dedmans buried there and we how they are related. If she was married to a Dedman, the only possibility is John William Dedman (Nov. 28, 1900-Aug. 15, 1971). He is the son of David Martin and Cordelia Walborn Dedman.

His parents are listed as Robert Lee and Mary Susan (Jewett) Dedman. According to the information on Family Search, Robert Lee's father is listed as Taliferio Didman. One can easily see how that could be a corruption of Dedmon. The Taliferio surname is connected to the Dedman family. Robert Tallafarro married Katherine Deadman, the daughter of Henry Deadman/Dedman and Katherine Frances Jennings (The widow of Charles Grymes). It is possible Taliferio Didman is somehow connected to that particular family, although I have no record of it. However, it was and is a common practice to use a surname for a first name of a descendent.
