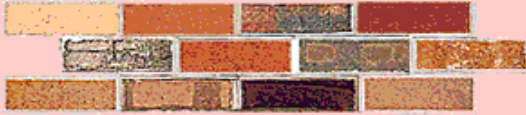

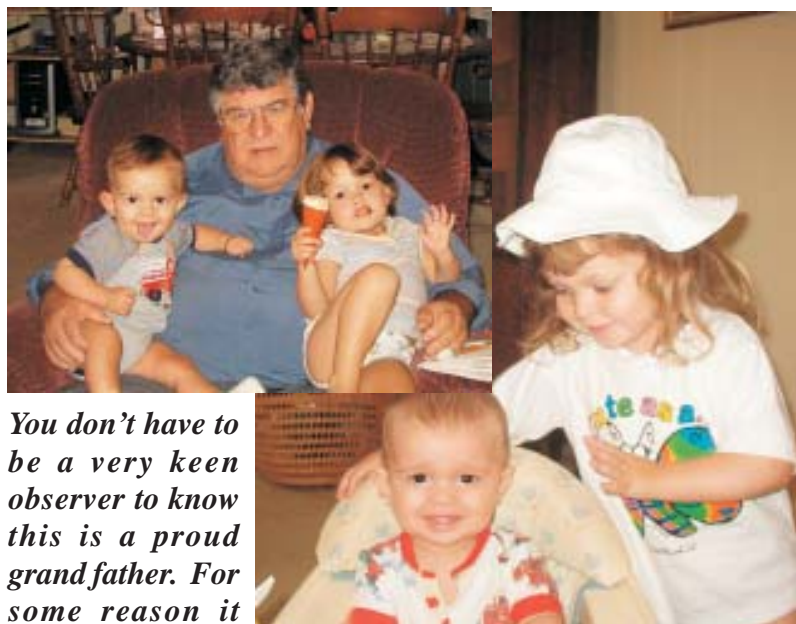


BIRTHDAY

that I have been trying to get corrected for almost 2 years. First, I am Sarah Catherine Dedman, the last child born to Henry Wilbur Dedman and Effie Gibbs Roseman and I was born January 23, 1922, in Houston, Texas.

The first child born to them was Effie Catherine Dedman who died at birth in 1906. Second, I was married to Robert C. Calhoun in May, 1940 and had 2 sons, Robert Jr., born Aug. 25, 1941 and William Dedman Calhoun, born Jan.28, 1945. (I am no longer married to Calhoun but to Duane U. Woodfield - no children. Robert Jr., had one son who died in 1996, no children. William married Rosemarie D. Camp in 1979 and they have one son, William Dedman Calhoun II, born in 1979 and one daughter, Rebecca R. Calhoun, born in 1982. Neither of the two children are married.

I think that just about straightens out my part of the Dedman tribe as far as I know. Hope you can straighten the records out re my birth date, as I surely wasn't born in 1907 and I didn't die in 1907!! We all live in Sarasota, Fl.
