JESUS IS THE REASON FOR EVERY SEASON

I certainly am not unthankful folks are thinking of Jesus during this time of the year. However, it does sadden me so many forget him the other eleven months. I remember the cartoon showing the man leaving the church building and saying, "I wish they would put Christmas and Easter on the same day, this running back and forth to church is getting me down." I often see signs with the phrase, "Jesus is the reason for the season." This reflects the omission of the great truth ... "**Jesus is the reason for all seasons.**"


There is no doubt Jesus was born, we just do not know when. Scholars and historians generally agree he was not born on December 25. This is a day selected by a major religion to celebrate what they called *Cristes Maesse*, the Mass of Christ. Concerning the date of Christ's birth the Gospels give no help; upon their data many contradictory arguments are based. The census would have been impossible in winter: a whole population could not then be put in motion. It is also very doubtful shepherds would have been in the field.

The original significance of December 25 was a well-known festival day celebrating the annual return of the sun. December 21 is the winter solstice (shortest day of the year and thus a key date on the calendar). December 25th is the first day ancients could clearly note the days were definitely getting longer and the sunlight was returning. Through the years the general populous has come to accept the date without question.

Again the phrase, "Let's keep Christ in Christmas" (or put him back), indicates the gross misunderstanding which includes so many. Don't get me wrong, we need to keep Christ in all phases of our life, but let's not limit Him to the one day or season of the year. I for one, would applaud the singing of Silent Night on July 4th or Memorial Day. In other words, don't put Christ in the closet with the tree and decorations until next year.

The commercialism of Christmas is disgusting to me. It has reached the point where merchants have begun their decorations and advertising before Thanksgiving. Now, lest one think I am an old scrooge, I want to make "one thing perfectly clear" ... I am in favor of exchanging gifts. I sometimes feel like the one who said, "*The good book says that it is more blessed to give than receive, but receiving is good enough for me.*" We quit fighting the crowds for shopping years ago in favor of giving money to our recipients. I have considered placing a note in the envelope which says, "*If this is the wrong size, I will exchange it for a size smaller.*" This year we made agreements with the family not to exchange gift cards. This may have been promoted by the fact so many businesses are reported to be going out of business. I cringed when the thought occurred that I may receive a gift card on a store which closed their doors on December 26.

I really enjoy the "holiday season", which in my opinion begins around the first of November as families begin making plans to gather for traditional meals for both Thanksgiving and Christmas. It seems there is an overall spirit of caring and sharing. Of course, events such as the Wal-Mart employee being trampled to death by eager shoppers certainly take away from, "'tis the season to be jolly"....

Here in Branchville, S.C., where my wife of now 50 years (June 14, 1957), Mazie and I live in retirement. Our town’s citizens are also selling prints of the old Railroad Freight Depot to raise funds. The old building is in great disrepair and needs a lot of help. One of our neighbors caught a heavy machinery operator just minutes from leveling what is left of the old building in recent months. Actually, the food was delivered to FDR in his coach due to his confinement to a wheel chair. Every fall here in Branchville, we celebrate the railroad history of the area with the Branchville Rayle Rode Dayze Festival. It is always a lot of fun and sometimes educational. 
Leon Dedmon, my great grandfather, died today. I thought I would pass this on to any Dedmons who may know him or are in close relationship to him.



I have discovered at least five major Deadman branches that we have not been able to connect. If you have information on any of the Deadman family branches, please submit.

Leroy,

It has been quite a few years since I corresponded with you. My 3xgreatgrandfather was Jacob Wolfe, married to Nancy McEntire. He supposedly was the Jacob Wolfe on Mark Dedmon's Revolutionary Pension Application in Rutherford County, NC. I received some info from Floyd Dedmon back in 2002 that the Jacob above had a father also named Jacob Wolfe and married to Mary Polly Deadman Mark Dedmon's sister not his daughter. I never knew why I never heard from Floyd Dedmon after 2002 that he had passed. I had found a Tim Dedmon and he told me.

Jacob wolf was listed under the names of Mark Dedmon's children and someone named I believe was called Bobby Dedmon who said Jacob was believed to be Mark Dedmon and Hannah Bailey's grandchild. Also in the info he sent he said it hadn't been proven but this first Jacob was Cherokee Indian and called "Crazy Fox". Also was from the same tribe as Prudence "Sly Fox" Bryan, who married Richard Cheshire in Bladen County, NC. They had a daughter and her name was Sarah Prudence "Little Fox" Cheshire. She married a Singletary, I believe his name was James.

I have been in contact with a Charlie Cheshire that descended from Prudence "Sly Fox" Bryan Chesire. In a census there was Richard Cheshire and under mulatto or not white there was one female listed. He also said that Prudence "Sly Fox" and Jacob "Crazy Fox" came from Stokes county NC. I know that Sly Fox and "Little Fox" existed but haven't been able to prove or disprove that Jacob "Crazy Fox" existed. I have found no other info on the first Jacob Wolfe being the father of the second Jacob Wolfe. I do have 8 pages of Wolfe ancestors that the late Forest Wolfe of Shelby, NC wrote. My second Jacob Wolfe was supposed to be born in 1798, which is on his tombstone but on Mark Dedmon's Rev War Pension App his BD was 1794.

I have found and been found by some more Wolfes from Tennessee to Michigan and am corresponding with them. Maybe someone has the tidbit I have been looking for since 1999 about the first Jacob Wolfe and his heritage. I pray I find it before I pass on. If not I will leave my info with my oldest son, Ken Wells, so he can find his roots as well.

I have been mostly confined to bed since 2000. I am fighting MS and have Physical Therapy 2X a week in a rehab pool. I was finally approved for an electric Wheelchair last week so I hope in a couple of weeks I will have it. Please keep me in your prayers. I would if it's in God's will that I walk normally again and not fall because of my balance. I pray you and your family are well.

I hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving. My husband and I are in KY where he has been working. He got a call from his niece that she and her brother couldn't get their mother to come to the door and called police. They found her deceased on the couch. She was just 59. The coroner said it probably was a heart attack. We go back home to Alabama in the morning. We had planned to go to the Cemetery in Marshall County, KY where some of our Wolfe ancestors are buried. A son of my 3xgreatgrandfather Jacob Wolfe, named Sanford Wolfe wife, Martha Travis and some of their children are buried in Maple Springs cemetery just outside of Benton KY in Marshall County. Will have to make a trip back up here hopefully by the end of the year. Take care, Melanie Oates Malone [Whitewolfe0510@aol.com]

Dedmon concerned about student safety

Pat Dedmon is running for a seat on the Oakley School Board not because he believes things are bad, but because they could be better.

Pat Dedmon is running for a seat on the Oakley School Board not because he believes things are bad, but because they could be better. "I do think things here are good; the Oakley School District is a gem," he said. "But the times they are a'changin', and we just need to do what we can to continue to evolve and keep on top of things."

Dedmon, who is a mining technician at the Black Diamond Mines in Antioch, has three children: one at UC Davis, one at Freedom High and one in sixth grade. The first-time candidate heard about the school board position through a friend, who suggested he run. "I thought about it, and then said, 'Why not?' I am a very involved parent, and I think I could bring a lot to the board," said Dedmon. "I want to see the school district continue to do well as it grows and expands."

One of the ways he would do that, he said, is through an open dialogue among the parents, teachers, students and board members. "I'm talking about communication, real communication," he said. "A board member needs to be in touch with teachers and the needs of individual students. It's one thing to hear from management and what they are doing, but to actually go out there and touch each individual school and make sure everyone is getting what they need and want – well, that's a whole different thing." Dedmon is also concerned about student safety.

"One of my issues is that there seems to be a lot of violence in the schools," he said. "I've seen a climate change in the attitudes of children, and I think there needs to be a zero tolerance policy if a student brings a weapon to school. I think right now the district deals with it case by case, but I believe there needs to be a fair policy for everyone."

Eager to embrace the growing population, Dedmon said he also wants to see the area develop at a steady and responsible pace.

"I know we are expanding and building new schools. And one of my concerns is that with all the expansion, we need to make sure the older schools are being taken care of too in regard to repairs and upkeep," he said.

"I also want the teachers to be taken care of so we don't lose the great people we have. The teachers I have dealt with have been so impressive, and we want to make sure we have those same kinds of people in place when we open our new schools."

So Dedmon is not so much looking to shake things up as build on what is there. "I think the district is doing a good job, I do, especially when you read about what is going on in some of our neighboring cities," he said. "I believe I could bring a lot to the board if I get the opportunity."

It is good to see family members interested in improving the community in which he/she lives. I am not sure who won this race, but maybe one of our readers will know and inform us. (LD)
