I THINK SHE HAS QUIT COUNTING

On February 1, 2014 my beloved wife, Jane, of almost 55 years caught me in age. However, it won't last very long as I will pass her again on June 27. I am reminded every morning that I am not as young as I used to be. It just takes longer to "limber up" and by the time I am ready to face the world it is time to go to bed again. I can only be thankful I am able to feel the pain. I still remember the email I received prior to my 70th birthday which said, "Your warranty is up". Of course that was in reference to Psalms 90:10 *"The days of our years are threescore years and ten; and if by reason of strength they be fourscore years, yet is their strength labour and sorrow; for it is soon cut off, and we fly away."* My goal is to at least reach the *"if by reason of strength fourscore years"*, but that is only a little over five years away. I must be having a world of fun as time is really flying.

I would have known I am getting older if had just paid attention to my brethren in their prayers. When I first began preaching, I would hear prayers like, *"...and Father, we thank you for brother Dedmon and give him a long and useful life in the kingdom"*. Then in a few years, I began hearing things like, *"...and Father, we thank you for brother Dedmon and give him a ready recollection of the things he has prepared to say"*. Recently, I heard a brother pray, *"...and Father, we thank you for brother Dedmon and give him a few more years of service"*. I still wonder about the ready recollection, as I sure do need more of them as I grow older.

I wonder about the man who was filling out an application for one of those "greeter" jobs at Wal-mart. After his name and address he saw the word Zip with a blank line following. Knowing he had to fill in all the blanks, after a few minutes of thought he wrote, *".... not too bad for my age"*. I am probably more like the fellow who said, *"my get up and go has got up and went"*. Well enough complaining in one day.

My friend Jim Dearman, asked me to do a five minute segment called, *"LEAVING A LEGACY"*, on his, *"GOOD NEWS TODAY"* program. I began to wonder what I could possibly leave anyone, but after thinking it over, I decided I could leave for the next generation what the previous generation has left me. I have recorded 32 programs and written about 50. The *"GOOD NEWS PROGRAM"* is aired in Chattanooga, Memphis, Knoxville, Nashville and Huntsville as well as *"THE GOSPEL BROADCASTING NETWORK"* GBN is on about twenty cable systems throughout the United States as well as the internet (gbntv.org) and also on the smart phones and Roku. I am making plans to record eight more programs in the near future.

"LEAVING A LEGACY" is designed to give a bit of humor with a spiritual application. Leaving a Legacy for the next generation is serious business, but we don't ever want to forget to laugh. I think about the many things my parents taught me. For example, They taught me: **how to meet a challenge:** It would go something like this, *"Answer me when I talk to you"...* **(but mom)** *"Don't you talk back to me"...* About the science of **osmosis:** *"Shut your mouth and eat your supper".....* About **justice:** *"One day you'll have kids and I hope they turn out just like you"* About **irony:** *"Keep laughing and I'll give you something to cry about."...* About **making wise decisions:** When I would try to explain my reason for doing something, they would ask, *"Are you talking to me or some dummy?..."* I would always say *"I'm talking to you"* but that always resulted in some form of punishment so I decided I must be giving the wrong answer!! I am here to tell you that did not work!! don't try that at home folks!! The bible teaches us to honor the elderly (Lev. 19:32) but it also reminds us of the strength of the youth (Prov. 29:29).. While there may be a generation gap, we are wise who try to close it...



FUNERAL HOMES AND CEMETERIES

Most genealogy researchers spend a lot of time searching records from Funeral Homes and Cemeteries. This is one way to find a lot of information. Within the Dedmon Family, I have encountered a few cemeteries and funeral homes within the family.

The one I knew first hand was the **Deadman Funeral Home** in Manchester, TN. I knew personally the Deadman family however, the difference in spelling made me think there was no relation. Of course, I could not have been more wrong as the first thing I learned when beginning the research project was the original spelling of our surname was D-E-A-D-M-A-N. Actually, prior to that there were other spellings from a variant of Debenham, a place name of Suffolk, England.

Frank and Fred Deadman owned and operated the Manchester Funeral Home, aka, **DEADMAN FUNERAL HOME**. Now that was an oddity! In fact I heard it made "*Ripley's Believe It Or Not*". However, I have never seen that article. According to Manchester history, it was mentioned on the TV programs, *laugh In and Johnny Carson*. After the death of Frank and Fred, Frank's widow, Bobbie and the grandsons of Fred (Thomas and Jeff) eventually sold the business and is known only as the Manchester Funeral Home. Fred's son, Thomas, passed away prior to his father.

There was a Dedmon Funeral Home in Mountain Grove, Missouri several years ago, but in 1980 merged with what is now know as the Craig-Hurtt Funeral Home, owned by Ben and Rhonda Hurtt. (*I have to restrain myself from commenting on the Hurtt Funeral Home, as that is somewhat less than dead.*)

It seems to me there was a Dedmon Funeral Home in Texas, but I am not able to locate it. I could be mistaken as that possibility is always present.

I am aware of at least eight "Family Cemeteries":

(1) **The Dedmon Cemetery**, Catoosa County, GA is located on the east side of Taylor's Ridge near the site of the old Mount Nebo Church and School. It is approximately 10 miles south of Ringgold. See Volume 66 for more information and a list of interments.

(2) **The Deadman Cemetery** in Mocksville, NC Danny McBee sent me some pictures and directions which are published in Volume 2 of this newsletter. Go to the Lakeland Motel, opposite where Deadmon Road begins on Highway 601. Stay on Deadmon Road to

dead end, then turn right about a half mile, then left on Cherry Road. The cemetery is located in a pasture high up on a hill above a creek.

(3) **Dedmons Cemetery** in Stoneham, Grimes County, Texas. Notes and/or description from FindAgrave.com: Take hwy 1774, south from Anderson toward Plantersville. About 8.8 miles from Anderson, turn right on hwy 2445 and go 2 miles to Dedmon Road/Treybrooks Oaks Road. Follow road to entrance of Treybrooks Oaks Farms; drive past a barn on right and residence on left to another barn. Cemetery is behind this barn.

(4) **Deadmond Cemetery** in Sandoval, Marion County, Illinois. Out of 347 interments, 113 are listed with the surname Deadmond. However, some of them are wives of Dedmond husbands. The Deadmond cemetery is located 4 miles from Sandoval, IL, where generations of Deadmonds and Wilbourns were buried. "The Deadmond cemetery



was originally started when a sick old native American guy came knocking on their door one night during the winter. They had tried to get him back to health, but couldn't. When he died, they buried him under a tree at the bottom of a hill, with a big rock as his headstone. You can still see the rock today, but its harder to find because its surrounded by bushes and trees."

Dedman Cemetery in Dallas County, AR: There are 48 interments listed in FindAgrave.com and seven with the surname Dedman. According to the sign it was incorporated in 1871. Eli John Quarles was buried in 1861, ten years prior to the incorporation.



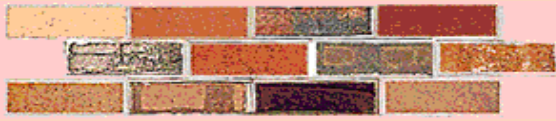
Dedman Cemetery in Helton, DeKalb County, Tennessee USA Cemetery notes and/or description: This was probably a family burial ground, and may or may not be there in present day. It is, however, listed in the DeKalb Co Cemetery list. The only listing is James Franklin Johnson and I have no idea his relationship to the Dedman family.

Dedman Cemetery in Cluttsville, Madison County, Alabama. FindAgrave.com lists this with only one person, William Dedman, b. 1810. The notation says this may be an error as there is no proof of his burial there.



Dedman Cemetery in Pike County, Indiana. This is a small family cemetery next to the old charity farm property. There are five graves, all Dedman. **Samuel Dedman, Jr**, appears to be the first person buried in this location. His ancestry has eluded us.

THE NAME BURTON

In looking back over my correspondence and old news-letters in preparing the Obituary Index, I came across a letter from a distant cousin, Nancy Hofstetter. In the letter she asked, "...do you know where the Burton is from - keeps cropping up..." I had often wondered that myself as there are several in her family with the middle name Burton. It began with my grandfather's brother, Alfred **Burton** Dedmon and thereafter was his son, William **Burton** Dedmon, who then named his son Richard **Burton** Dedmon. I don't have any family info on Richard, so I don't know if anyone else was named Burton in that Dedmon line. There was a Carol Burton Dedmon, Sr., which also says she was a Jr., but I don't know where they fit into the tree as we are missing his grandfather. He was born in 1897, which places him earlier than Richard, who was born in 1911.

There were a couple of Burtons on my mother's side of the family through the Templeton family. Albert **Burton** Templeton b. 1860 and Austin **Burton** Templeton b. 1936. There was a Jack **Burton** Henney b. 1911, married to Delores Amelia Deadman. **Burton** Randol was married to Jamie Beth Dancer, a granddaughter of Ada Roseman Dedman.

Parents named their boys in the 1860's much as they do now. Some of the more popular names have always been: John, James, Adam, Thomas, Matthew, Philip, Henry, David, Timothy, Robert, William, Joseph. Biblical names were popular then, too: Benjamin, Abraham, Jonas, Saul, Paul, Jeremiah, Samuel, Micah. Many times boys were given a family surname (last name) as a first name: Jefferson, Mitchell, Anderson, Thompson, Carlisle, Winston, Franklin, Milton. And, of course, a very popular name for boys in the late 1860's (after the U.S. Civil War): Lincoln.

My first reaction was that there must have been a Burton married to a Dedmon somewhere about the time Alfred Burton Dedmon was born. My search turned up only one. John James Dedmon married Martha G. Burton in 1872. That was of no help in this situation for a couple of reasons. Alfred Burton Dedmon was born almost twenty years before that marriage took place and I could not find a family connection to John James Dedman. It appears he is of the Christopher Deadman lineage of which we have not found a connection.

Actually I could not find any support for Burton being a popular name in the 1800s at all and in 1910 it ranked 263 out of a possible 1000. That's not too bad since Leroy only ranked 61. John of course was number one with William, James, Robert and Joseph following close behind. Vicente ranked last with names like Zigmund, Cornell and Newman fighting for that last spot. Surprising, Edmond ranked 136. I only mentioned that because we have some Edmond Dedmons in our tree. That is of course a mother's surname, given to her son, which was and is a very common practice.

The name Burton is of English origin meaning Bright Frame, so I guess one might think of their son in that respect. However, my guess is that Burton was given as a name because of some popular person in and around the time. I found three possibilities:

(1) Sir Richard Francis Burton (1821 – 1890) was an English geographer, explorer, translator, writer, soldier, orientalist, cartographer, ethnologist, spy, linguist, poet, fencer and diplomat. He was known for his travels and explorations within Asia, Africa and the Americas, as well as his extraordinary knowledge of languages and cultures. According to one count, he spoke 29 European, Asian and African languages

(2) William Evans Burton (1804-1860) was a British-American comic actor and playwright, born in London in September 1804, was the son of William George Burton, a printer and author of Research into the religions of the Eastern nations as illustrative of the scriptures

(3) Francis Burton Craige (1811 – 1875) was a Congressional Representative from North Carolina; born near Salisbury, North Carolina, March 13, 1811; attended a private school in Salisbury, and graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1829. He was editor and proprietor of the Western Carolinian 1829-1831; studied law; was admitted to the bar in 1832 and commenced practice in Salisbury. He was one of the last borough representatives in the State house of representatives 1832-1834; elected as a Democrat to the Thirty-third and to the three succeeding Congresses (1853-1861); chairman, Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds, delegate to the State secession convention in 1861 and introduced the Ordinance of Secession in the form in which it was adopted; delegate to the Provisional Congress of the Confederate States which met in Richmond, 1861.

Well your guess is as good as mine, if not better. If you have a idea of this and wish to share, please do. I was asked and so I felt obligated to try to give an answer. --- Leroy

In Volume 77 of this newsletter I featured Roy Lane Dedmon, who spent much of his life in the armed services. However, in 1946 he left the Army and became an active member of the Army Reserves. Four years later he returned to active duty for about 15 years. In 1967 Roy returned to Texas Chiropractic College in Pasadena, Texas to reinstate his Chiropractic license. Body of Dustin Deadman Recovered

The body of a 25-year-old Hillsboro man has been recovered on Tims Ford Lake, according to Franklin County officials.

Dustin Deadman was on a fishing trip Monday with his son and nephews when the boat they were in began taking on water. Officials said Deadman made sure the children were safe before diving into the water.

That's when he began calling for help and one of the children tossed him a life-preserver, Franklin County Sheriff's Department official Chris Guess said. But Deadman was not able to reach the preserver and slipped under water. Dive teams using sonar searched the lake for three days before recovering Deadman's body Wednesday afternoon.

ESTILL SPRINGS, Tenn. – Dive teams have recovered the body of a Coffee County man who went missing at Tims Ford Lake in Franklin County.

Officials said 26-year-old Dustin Deadman from Hillsboro went missing Monday after going out to the lake to fish. Search and recovery teams found Deadman's body around 3 p.m. Wednesday.

Chief Allen Rhodes with the Estill Springs Police Department said Deadman was going fishing with four young boys. He was launching his boat from the Estill Springs City Park when it got away from him and started floating out into the lake.

Deadman tried to swim to the boat, but the boys told police he went under the water and did not resurface.

The boys were able to make it back to the shore and call 911 emergency dispatchers.
