When my grandmother, Alice Walker, passed away, her sister, Toni Walker, took my father to her home and there he was reared. Toni was married to Charles Cline. Dad told me he thought his last name was Cline until he reached his teen years and discovered his father. The story is told that he was walking from Ringgold to Houston Valley, when a couple picked him up in a wagon. As it turned out this couple was Olan and Pearl Templeton Dickson Vess. She was my grandmother and had married Olan Vess after my mother's father passed away in 1918, the same year dad's mother passed away. In fact they died within a week of each other. When dad told them who he was, they said you are actually Gordon Dedmon and we live near your father and took him to his house. He later met Ruby Dickson, the daughter of Pearl and was married on July 4, 1938. I was born on June 27, 1939, the first of five children. As a boy, I used to say, "I was born in June and mom and dad married in July". Mom told me I ought not say it that way as it did not sound very good. I didn't understand at the time, but someone later explained it to me.

Growing up, we visited often with Bonnie and Ed Cline. Ed was one of the five children of Charles and Toni. Playing badminton with them is the activity I remember most. This is probably where dad learned to play so well as he was the champion in the family for a long time. I would sound like I was bragging if I told who finally beat him, so I won't mention any names.

Ed and Bonnie are buried in the National Cemetery in Chattanooga. Ed served in the U.S. Navy and passed away in 1995 and Bonnie in 2003. I could not locate Ed's obituary, but found Bonnie's. I never knew any of the other children of Charles and Toni.

In 2007 he moved to a nursing home in Silsbee and really loved it. He was such a people person that he had many to be with there, where at home I was the only one. He was only bedfast about a week before his death. I have continued to live here though I would have gladly left many years ago. Now it is easier to stay. Our daughter Cynthia lives in Houston (about 2 hours away) so until something drastically changes I will stay here.

I will attach the full obituary, as what is on Find A Grave is just taken from the obit. I am sorry that I cannot just do an attachment, but will put the full obituary at the bottom of this message. I am not suggesting that you use the long obituary, just what you want to use. The rest is just for your personal information. R. Lynn Cook passed away on March 21, 2014 in Colorado Springs, CO. Born in Rockwood, TN on January 28, 1947, Lynn attended Crossville High School and graduated from MTSU in Murfreesboro, TN.

Lynn had a long and varied career in Health Care Administration starting in 1974 with the Department of Health for the state of Tennessee. He worked as a physician recruiter, hospital developer, and a group practice manager throughout his career. Lynn's life and career took him from Tennessee to Kentucky, Texas and finally Colorado where he retired in 2009.

Lynn is survived by his wife, Liz Cook of Colorado Springs, his daughter, Jordan Cook and grandchildren, Finn and Hayden Campbell of London, England. He is also survived by his siblings; JC Cook and Donna Yates of Crossville, TN and Ann McCullough of Mt. Juliet, TN.

Services were conducted Saturday, March 29th at Bond Memorial Chapel, 1098 Weston Drive, Mt. Juliet, TN. Visitation from noon until 2pm followed by a memorial service at 2pm.

A Celebration of Lynn's life and a Memorial Hike was held at the Garden of the Gods Park (High Point parking lot) in Colorado Springs on April 18th at 1pm.

Lynn's wife is the daughter of Roy Lane Dedmon. He and I share William D. Dedmon as our great grandfather. THE DEDMON CONNECTION, Volumn 77, featured Roy and his service in the Army. Although I have never met any of these cousins, I have drawn close to them through the years by our correspondence. Actually, I believe my father met Roy's son, Guy, in Huntsville, AL back in the 60s, while working at Redstone Arsenal and Guy was in the Army. I was living in Manchester, TN when Roy's family lived in Murfreesboro, TN. No doubt our paths have crossed. I sent Liz the following note on Facebook upon hearing of Lynn's passing:

"Liz, I don't know if you will get this message or not anytime soon as I know you are traveling and have other things on your mind. Although I have not personally met any of your family, I consider you among my close kin. I am so sorry about Lynn and extend to you my love and sympathy. I wish I could be in Nashville this week-end, but my circumstances will not allow me to do so. I was near there last weekend at McMinnville, TN. It is so ironic that we lived 30 miles away when you were in Murfreesboro.... Maybe some day we will meet...." Leroy

CHARLES E. DEADMON

Charles Edwin Deadmon, 80, was born in Reed OK, and died April 22, 2009, in Silsbee, TX. Graveside services will be held April 27, 2009 in Eldorado, OK, with Cecil Deadman (first cousin to Charles) officiating. A memorial service will be held in Silsbee at a later date.

His parents were James W “Jim” and Lizzie Burden Deadmon, who preceded him in death. During his school years he lived with his family in the community of Victory, Oklahoma. He graduated from high school in Victory. During his summers he spent months with custom combine crews cutting wheat in the area of Oklahoma, Kansas, and Nebraska.

He enlisted in the U S Army in 1946. He was a Veteran of World War II and served in Korea Occupation Army for over a year. Upon his return in 1948 he became a student at Central University in Edmond, Oklahoma. In 1950 he and Marianne Dial were married in Eldorado, Oklahoma.

The year before their marriage he became employed with a seismograph crew, that became his occupation for many years. This work took him to many states and enabled him and his family to have the opportunity to see much of the Western States. This provided them the chance to meet many new friends, understand the culture of the areas, and travel to sites of interest.

In 1961 he began working for the Federal Government working at that time at the Nevada Test Site where the Atomic bombs were tested. His next work involved monitoring of earthquakes. This expanded the areas where he worked which included Puerto Rico, Alaska, and the East Coast. He spent 20 years with the U S Government Service and retired in 1981. He returned to the seismograph business and remained there until 1989. From 1990 until 1998 he worked as a security guard in the S E Texas area. After that retirement he spent his extra time volunteering in the office at the First United Methodist Church. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Silsbee.

He is survived by his wife, Marianne Deadmon of Silsbee; daughter and husband, Cynthia and Roy King; grandchildren, Shari King, Toby King and wife Meredith, with their children Riley, Tommy, and Mackenzie all living in Houston. He is survived by one uncle, Buford Deadman, of New Jersey and an aunt, Doris Hinson of Bedford, Texas.

Pallbearers will be Toby King, Roy King, Jack Hinson, Doug Davis, Elden Miner and Henry Goodin.. The honorary pallbearers will be Harvey Thomason and Jimmie Stout, Leon Dollins, Delmar Martin, and other cousins and friends from his association with Victory.

His hobbies included working, photography and collections. He loved music of any kind, from Classical on down. His photography hobby took him to all counties in Texas where he photographed the Court Houses. He was a kind, faithful individual who loved his family, church, and friends. If remembrances are chosen they may be made to the First United Methodist Church of Eldorado or the Victory Cemetery Fund.

Among those whom I was privileged to meet (via email) very early in my family research project was Marianne (Dial) Deadmon. Due to the events taking place in my life the past few years I was not aware of the death of Charles. I discovered it while researching findagrave.com. Charles family is closely connected to the Deadman family in Middle Tennessee that I met when I moved to Manchester, (Coffee County) TN in 1964. I have mentioned more that once my association with Fred and Frank Deadman, the owners of Deadman Funeral Home in Manchester. Leaving Manchester in 1968, I moved to Morrison (Warren County), TN. where there is a strong connection between the Turners and Deadmans. In 1971 I preformed the wedding ceremony of Marion Turner and Connie Prater. Among the children born to that union was Jeniffer Turner, who married Chad Turner. To our knowledge there is no kinship between those two Turner families. Chad, however is part of the Deadman/Turner families. His great aunt, (Kate Pearl Turner) was married to Johnnie Hugh Dedmon, the son of William Oscar Deadmon. As Marianne reminded me in a recent exchange of email, the spelling of our surname (Deadman, Deadmon, Dedmon, Dedman, etc.) varies among our families.

BOBBIE VANHOOSER DEADMAN

DEADMAN, Bobbie VanHooser, age 92 of Manchester, Tennessee, passed away on October 21, 2010 at the Manchester Health Care Center. Mrs. Deadman was born on December 12, 1917 in Gainesboro, Tennessee to her parents, the late Zeb and Alta VanHooser. She was also preceded in death by her husband, Frank Deadman; brothers, Buford VanHooser, Malcolm VanHooser and Berferd VanHooser and nephew, Fred Tommy Deadman, Jr.

Mrs. Deadman's husband, Frank , was one of the original funeral business partners in Jackson, Deadman and Stroud which opened in March 1932. Frank and Fred Deadman later purchased the funeral business in January of 1946 which was known as the Manchester Funeral Home. Mr. Deadman served over 50 years in the funeral service business and the Manchester Funeral Home was often referred to as the "Deadman's" Funeral Home. Mrs. Deadman also owned and operated the Modernistic Hair Styling Salon for over 40 years and also assisted her husband in the funeral business. She was a member of the Main Street Church of Christ.

She is survived by her sister-in-law, Willie VanHooser of Gallatin, TN; niece, Tommie Louise VanHooser Kershaw and her husband James of Hendersonville, TN; nephew, Bill VanHooser (Leslie) of Baltimore, Maryland; great niece, Crytal Michelle Cox of Madison, TN; niece-in-law, Brenda Deadman of Manchester, TN; great-nephews, Thomas Deadman, III of Panama City, Florida and Jeff Deadman of Memphis, TN; great-great-nephew, Dustin Deadman; great-great-niece, Ashley Deadman; her Church family at Main Street Church of Christ and a host of friends.
